Featured Artist - Umanee

Umanee is one of the most interesting bands to emerge within the Melbourne world music scene within the past few years. Umanee was formed in 2004 by Peter Novotnik – a composer and multi-instrumentalist from Poland. Originally a guitarist, Peter's eclectic musical tastes and wealth of talent have led him to take up a











diverse array of instruments including hurdy-gurdy, baglama, Uyghur khushtar, oud and Karadeniz kemence (traditional Black Sea violin). Following his arrival in Australia, Peter soon began to gather around him a group of talented musicians from diverse musical backgrounds. Together, they began shaping a unique and original sound project inspired by Scandinavian, French, Middle Eastern and Balkan traditions, and this project grew into Umanee.

The music of Umanee is inspired by a wide range of the world's cultural heritage. Together with original material, Umanee has made the effort to reintroduce forgotten musical traditions and instruments, and to blend them with classical ones to give their music a new, contemporary sound. Many songs are associated with a specific culture or region, but they are not simply traditional folk music. While each of the instruments has its own rich history, the way that they are used is enriched by the musicians' experience, taste and imagination. These factors, together with a knowledge of classical and contemporary forms, help to create the shape of Umanee's sound - an "earthy" fusion, ranging from energetic dance forms to mystical "landscapes".

Along with Peter, the band members include Bill Thompson (percussion), Dushan Mitrovic (clarinet), Michael O'Connor (flute) and Keryn Lientshnig (cello, viola). Umanee has performed at many live music venues around Melbourne, and at festivals including Maldon Folk Festival and Fusion Arts Festival. Their music is often intriguing and always beautiful.

Living Traditions Showcase Concerts: The two showcase concerts during the Winter in Banyule Festival were a great success, with excellent performances from Triskel and Underbelly on Saturday 12 August, and from Glen Kniebeiss and Chris Sprague, BabaGanoush and Marina Bistrin on Saturday 19 August. A total audience of around 200 people was recorded across the two concerts. Thanks to all audience members who provided feedback. Difficulties with visibility of performers were identified at the first concert and led to a different staging layout for the second concert.
